

Lesson

1. Opener bid 1 NT
2. Promises at least 2 cards in every suit
3. Responder initiates a transfer
4. Opener accepts the transfer
5. Responder's 2nd bid ...
 - a. 0-7 HCP → Pass
 - b. 8-9 HCP and 5 of the major → bid 2 NT
 - c. 10-15 HCP and 5 of the major → bid 3 NT
 - d. 8-9 HCP and 6 of the major → bid 3 of the major
 - e. 10-15 HCP and 6 of the major → bid 4 of the major

Substance

It is the responder's job to show his HCP after the transfer.

With 5 of the major:

- The responder can only assume the opener has 2 of the major
- The responder + opener have a 7-card match (all that can be assumed)
- The responder bids 2 NT with 8-9 HCP
- The responder bids 3 NT with 10-15 HCP
- If the opener has 3 of the major, he may correct the responder's 2 NT/3 NT to the major

With 6 of the major:

- The opener has 2 of the major
- With responder's 6-card holding, they have a fit

- The responder bids 3 of the major with 8-9 HCP
- The responder bids 4 of the major with 10-15 HCP
